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Housing Rehabilitation Program

The City of Pompano Beach Office of Housing and Urban Improvement will be distributing preliminary applications for single family, owner-occupied housing rehabilitation assistance for those homes in the City of Pompano Beach that need to be rehabilitated but the home owner is unable to pay for the renovations.

This hugely popular Housing Rehabilitation Program offers 0% interest deferred loans for the purpose of completing improvements to eligible low- income single family homes. If you are an eligible, low- income household that owns and occupies a home in the City of Pompano Beach, you may qualify for up to \$60,000 to make repairs including electrical and plumbing upgrades, heating repairs, roofing, window replacement, and accessibility modifications.

Since there may be a large turn out for the loans, the procedure for obtaining the funds will be done in a three tiered, organized lottery process.

1. Receive Application

Preliminary applications will be available to be picked up for three days in the City Commission Chambers at 100 West Atlantic Boulevard beginning on **February 17th from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.;** **February 18th from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and February 19th from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.** Upon arrival, residents will be given a number in the order they arrive to receive an application. Housing and Urban Improvement employees will call the numbers in order for the residents to receive an application and answer questions if necessary.

2. Fill out Application and Return

The applications are then taken home, filled out and returned to the Office of Housing and Urban Improvement on the 2nd floor of City Hall by **March 6th**. The application process will give priority to properties that have never received a grant. Those eligible must be low- income single family homes.

3. Recipients Chosen by Lottery

The applicants that meet the criteria will be chosen by a lottery system. Each eligible recipient will be given a number. Numbers will be picked by a drawing in the City Commission Chambers in April. The date of the drawing is yet to be determined based on the number of applications received and the time it takes to review those applications. The date of the drawing will be announced and the drawing will be open to the public.
