City personnel will then collect the items and deliver them to Food For The Poor who will transport the goods to Haiti to distribute among the needy. Due to the damage and destruction in the nation, shipping must be limited to specific items. **The only items that will be accepted are canned meats and fish, canned baby formula, evaporated and condensed milk and water.**
